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BACKGROUND

- The State and Local Implementation Grant Program (SLIGP) was created under the Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act of 2012
- SLIGP is a three-year, formula-based grant program requiring 20% matching funds
- Funding is to help states plan and prepare for the forthcoming nationwide Public Safety Broadband Network (PSBN)
- \$116.2 million in grants have been awarded to 54
 U.S. states and territories to date





Help states and territories plan for a nationwide Public Safety Broadband Network (PSBN) by:

- Supporting planning, consultation, and outreach activities
- Engaging local governments, rural entities, Tribal Nations and all disciplines of first responders
- Funding efforts to collect data on existing infrastructure and equipment

SLIGP OUTCOMES



- Enhance statewide governing bodies responsible for public safety communications to include broadband
- Effectively consult with FirstNet about characteristics and needs of states and territories
- Identify potential users for the forthcoming nationwide PSBN
- Update Statewide Communications Interoperability Plans (SCIP) to include public safety wireless broadband initiatives
- Collect data on existing infrastructure to help FirstNet plan for the forthcoming PSBN
